Government Structure

The **City of Boulder** is a home-rule municipality with a council-manager form of government. The elected City Council, which consists of a Mayor, a Deputy Mayor, and seven Council Members, sets the policies for the operation of the Boulder government. The administrative responsibility of the city rests with the City Manager, who is appointed by the Council.

Boulder County is governed by a three member Board of County Commissioners which approves the budget for the entire county government and oversees management of 10 county departments.

Health programs and services in Boulder are provided by Boulder County Public Health (BCPH). BCPH is governed by a voluntary board of five Boulder County citizens who are appointed to serve by the Boulder County Board of County Commissioners.

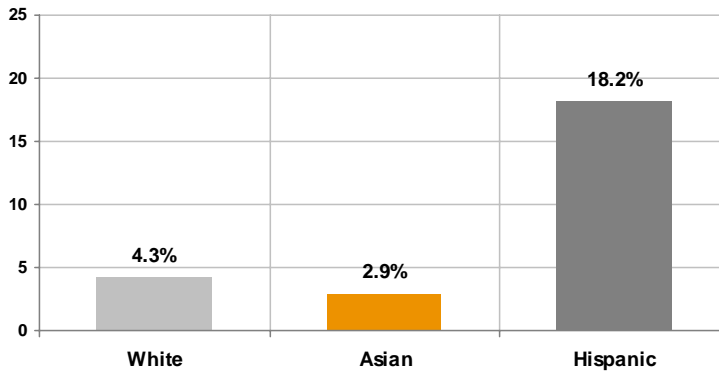

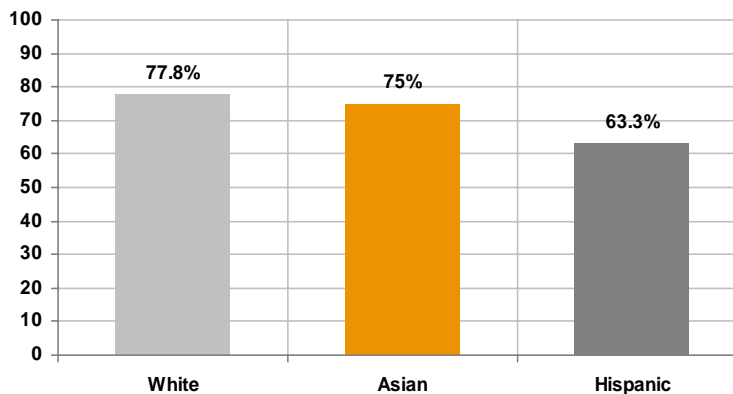

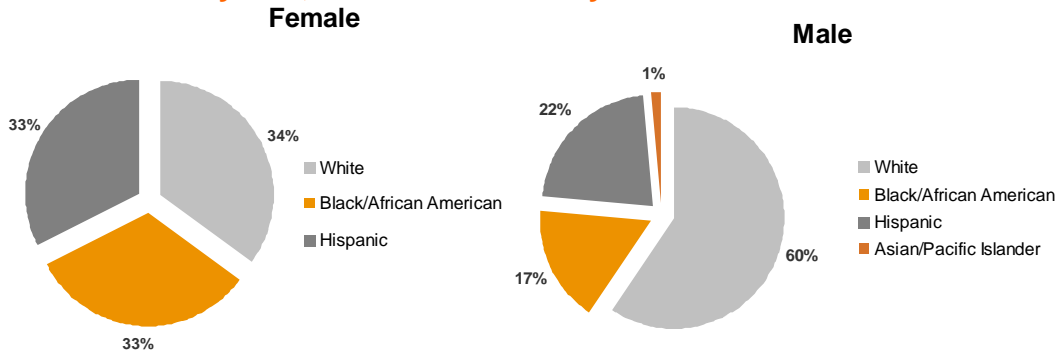

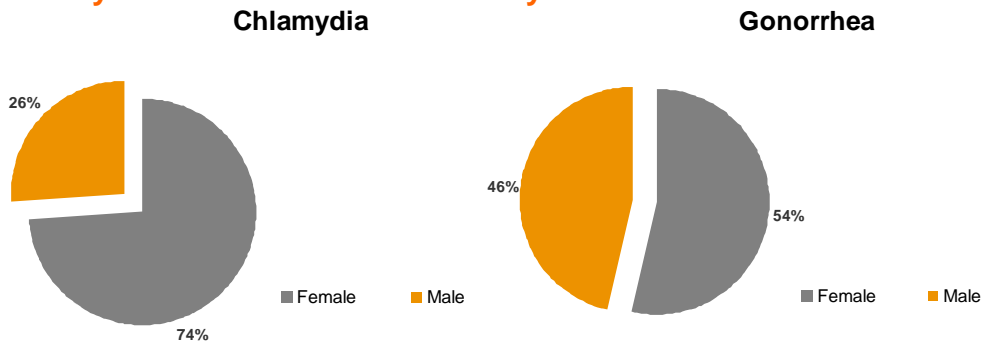
