Government Structure

The City of **Eugene** has a council-manager form of government. There is a Mayor and a City Council composed of eight Council Members. A City Manager provides administrative support to elected and appointed officials.

The **Lane County** Board of County Commissioners, which is comprised of five Board Members, has legislative and administrative powers. Through the County Administrator, the Office of County Administration implements Board-approved county policies. The Office also monitors financial activity and supervises administrative departments.

Under the guidance of a Director, the Lane County Department of Health and Human Services oversees the county's physical and mental health programs. The Lane County Public Health Department offers sexual health clinics, HIV testing and counseling, sexually transmitted disease prevention and treatment, prenatal services, and maternal and child health programs.

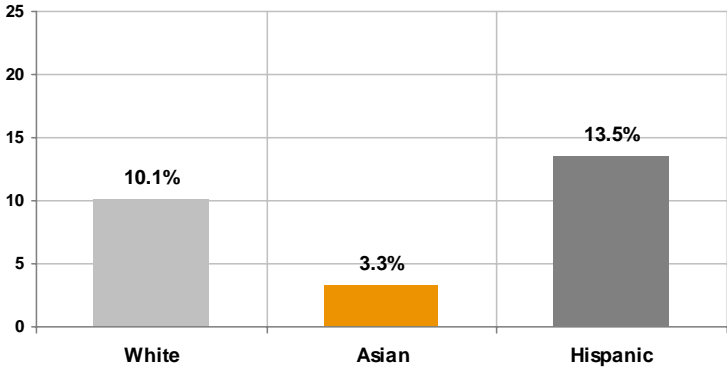

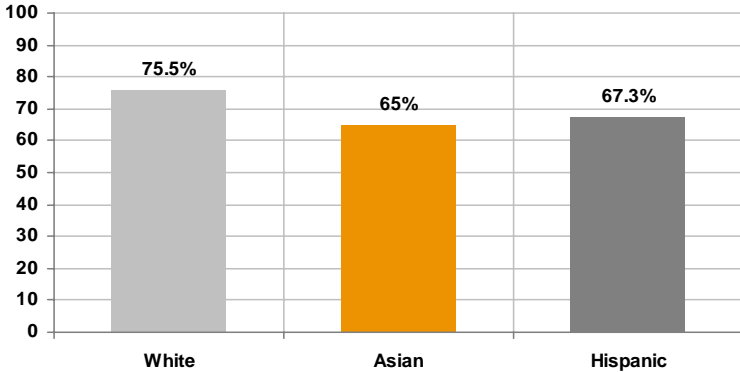

Share of Mothers That Received Adequate Prenatal Care by Race and Ethnicity

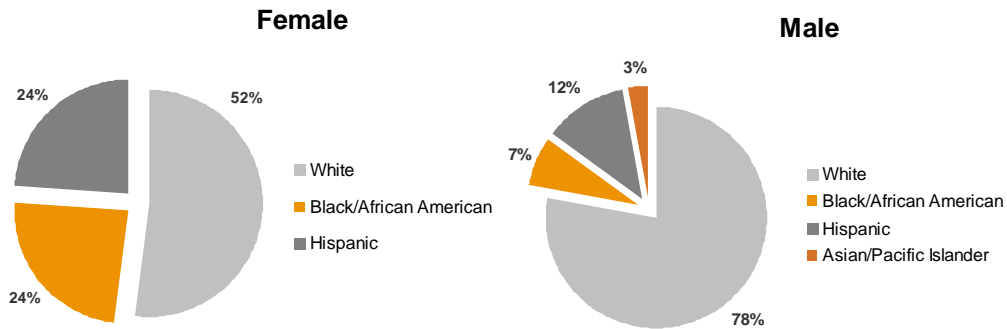


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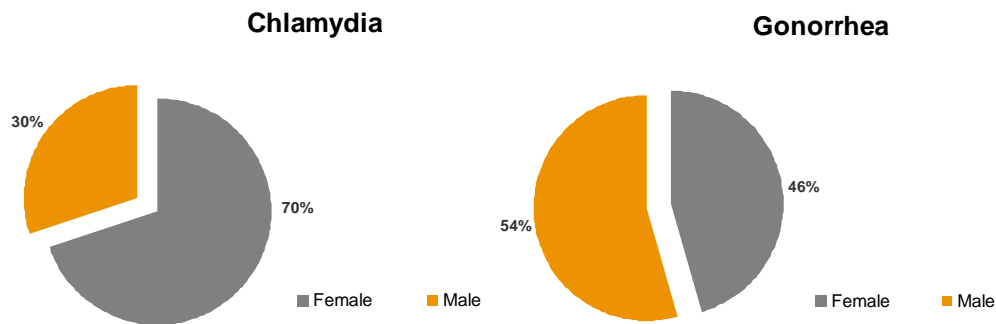
