Government Structure

Indianapolis, the county seat of **Marion County**, functions under a consolidated city-county government known as Unigov. Under Unigov, many functions of the city and county governments are consolidated, although some remain separate. The city has a mayor-council form of government, with the Mayor acting as chief executive of both the City of Indianapolis and Marion County. The City Council and County Council combined to form the 29 member City-County Council, which is the legislative branch of local government and is responsible for adopting budgets, levying taxes, and authorizing financial appropriations to fund city and county operations, as well as enacting, repealing, or amending local laws. Twenty-five Council Members are elected by districts and four Council Members are elected at-large.

The Health and Hospital Corporation of Marion County operates the Marion County Health Department. The Corporation is governed by a seven member Board of Trustees whose members are appointed by the Mayor of Indianapolis, the City-County Council and the County Commissioners. The Board has the authority to make and adopt appropriate ordinances.

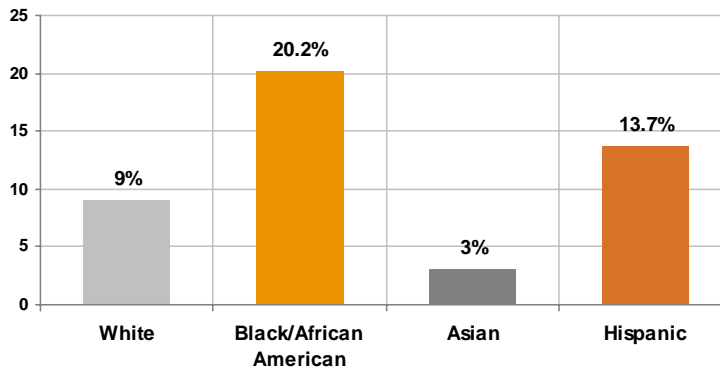

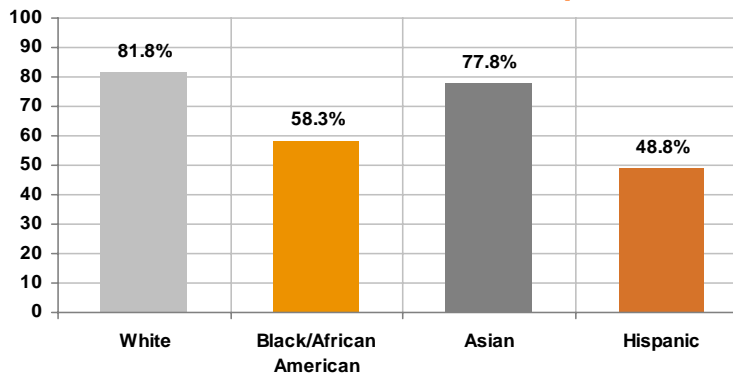

Share of Mothers That Received Adequate Prenatal Care by Race and Ethnicity

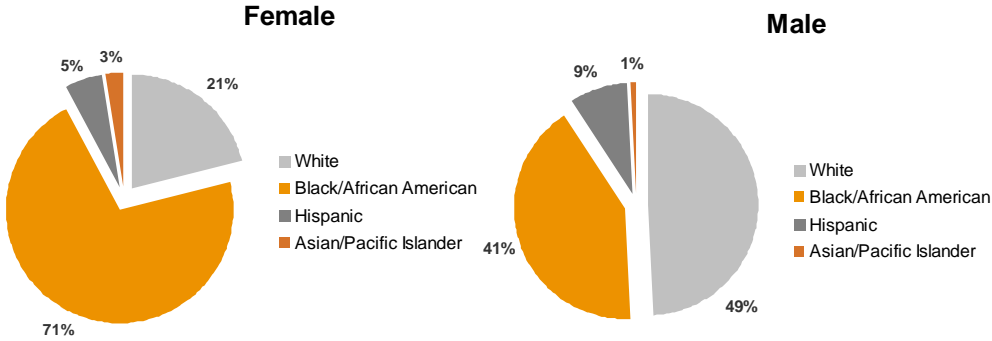
