### Government Structure

The **City of Madison**, the county seat of **Dane County**, has a mayor-council form of government. The city's legislative branch is composed of the Common Council, made up of 20 Alders elected from separate districts in the city to two-year terms. The Alders elect a Common Council President from among Council Members. The Mayor, elected to a four-year term, is the chief executive officer of the city. The Mayor has the power to veto any acts of the Council.

The Dane County Board of Supervisors is the legislative body of Dane County. Composed of 37 elected Supervisors from each of the districts in the county, the Board enacts county ordinances, levies taxes, passes laws concerning law enforcement, and appropriates money for services. Executive power lies with the County Executive, who is elected at-large by the county.

Public Health-Madison and Dane County (PHMDC) is the public health agency for the City of Madison and Dane County and is responsible for the promotion of wellness, prevention of disease, and provision of a healthy environment. PHMDC is governed by an eight member Board of Health that provides supervision to the Director and adopts rules and policies to protect and improve public health subject to approval of the Madison Common Council and the Dane County Board of Supervisors.

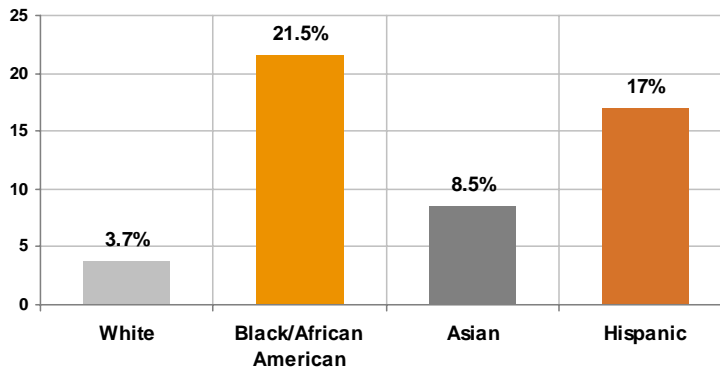

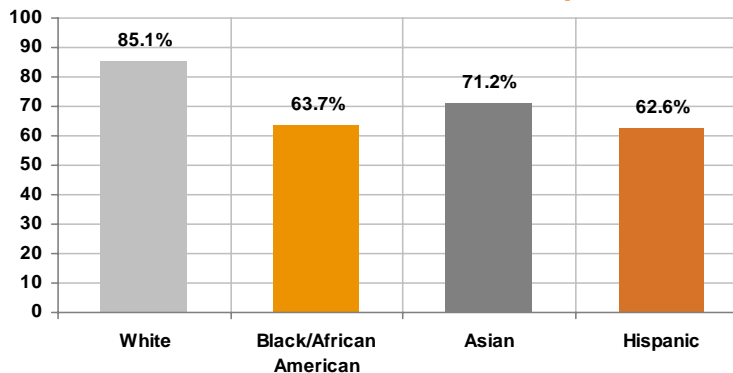

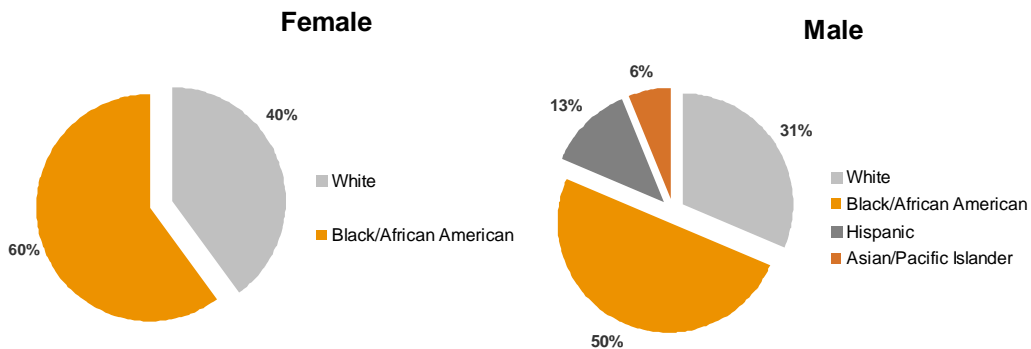

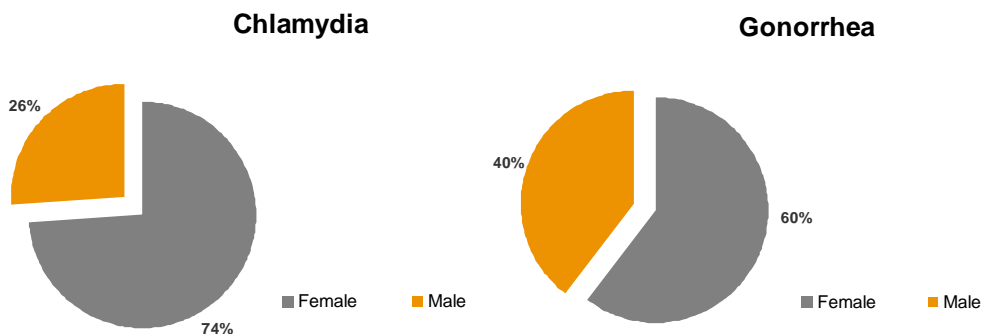
